

"The Practice of Paying Attention"

Exodus 3:1-5

Moses was keeping the flock of his father-in-law Jethro, the priest of Midian; he led his flock beyond the wilderness and came to Mount Horeb, the mountain of God. There the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a flame of fire out of a bush; he looked, and the bush was blazing, yet it was not consumed. Then Moses said, "I must turn aside and look at this great sight and see why the bush is not burned up." When the Lord saw that he had turned aside to see, God called to him out of the bush, "Moses, Moses!" And he said, "Here I am." Then he said, "Come no closer! Remove the sandals from your feet, for the place on which you are standing is holy ground."

Banned, Burned, and Buried: The Books NOT in the Bible

begins Wednesday, September 18 10:00-11:30 a.m. on Zoom



The Gospel of Thomas, The Gospel of Mary, The Gospel of Judas – Why are these gospels not in our Bible? What about the Book of Enoch, the Wisdom of Solomon, and the Apocalypse of Peter? Why were these books and others like them considered to be controversial or heretical, and worthy only of inclusion in a supplemental "apocrypha" or left out of the Bible altogether?

This fall, we'll begin a year-long video lecture series delving into the "lost" books of the Bible. We'll look at the books of the Old Testament that are in some Bibles but not in others – including stories of giants, dragons, and fallen angels. We'll explore the "Gnostic" gospels and other writings NOT in our New Testament – that offer alternative understandings of who Jesus was, who and what God is, and what our spiritual purpose is as created beings.

In each session, we'll watch a video together as a group and then have a discussion facilitated by Pastor Maureen. The class will meet every first and third Wednesday at 10:00 a.m. from September through May on Zoom All are welcome! 
TWILIGHT HIKE AND GHOSTLY TALES:
