THE SCRIPTURE LESSON

Matthew 6:25-33

Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds of the air; they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? THE POSTLUDE TODAY by George Frideric Handel was written to celebrate St. Cecilia's Day in 1739. Not only did he write this march but an entire oratorio in honor of this third-century patron saint of music, musicians, and poets. The text is based on a work by English poet John Dryden, who believed that music was a central force in the creation of the earth. The holiday is still celebrated on November 22 with Masses and concerts in some Catholic, Orthodox, Anglican, and Lutheran churches.

They are staying in the former parsonage for the church right next to Amherst Garden Center. She and her husband, David, have also directly sponsored more than 20 different families over the years and she will be sharing general info. about her work with this population, how to respectfully support them, and specific needs for the family they are sponsoring. Those interested in learning more and getting involved can ask her questions.

Millions of people throughout the world have been forced to flee their According to UNHCR, there were homes. 117.3 million forcibly displaced people at the end of 2023 due to persecution, conflict, violence and human rights violations. For the last 12 years, there has been an increase each vear in the number of forcibly displaced people. Many people come to the US as refugees or as asylum seekers. The decision people make to leave their family members. their country, their language and customs is not one that people make lightly.

Messiah Lutheran Church in Amherst, along with the help of other individuals and groups in the area, are sponsoring a family from Venezuela, a country in a socioeconomic crisis with an authoritarian government. As a family of 4, they fled through Colombia including braving the Darien Gap, a 66 mile walk through a jungle, one of the worst treks in the world with its serpents, insects, human traffickers, cash hungry cartel members, sexual abusers and killers. They rode for a few days on top of a freight train in Mexico with the two boys tied to their dad's belt and their mom pregnant with twins. With this sponsorship here in Amherst, this relational ministry has definitely been a blessing!
